

English



The majority of work in English will follow a cross-curricular approach and will often be focused around one text or theme. During the Autumn term, we will be beginning with the story *Flotsam* which will focus on using imagery to stimulate creative writing. We will then move onto non-fiction texts and poetry, using Space as our theme. Finally, we will explore a range of text types, using *Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone* as our stimulus – there will even be an opportunity to dress-up as one of the characters for our fun-filled Harry Potter themed day after half term.

There will be many opportunities for the children to develop their speaking and listening skills, through partner and group work, and drama will be used throughout the English curriculum as a stimulus for writing. Punctuation and grammar will form an integral part of English teaching and will be incorporated regularly into lessons. Spellings will be taught separately in short weekly sessions.

Children will receive regular Guided Reading sessions to develop their comprehension skills, vocabulary and reading fluency. They will also be taught basic library skills.

All English lessons/activities are in line with the National Curriculum.



Maths



We will be following the National Curriculum for Mathematics.

We will begin by revising place-value and exploring mental and written methods for all four number operations, as well as learning how to use these methods to conduct mathematical investigations and to solve problems.

The children will need to use their knowledge of times tables up to 12x12 to quickly answer questions and find patterns.

They will also practise reading and interpreting data, as well as representing data using graphs.



MFL- French

Weekly French lessons will enable children to count in French to 20, know the days of the week and months of the Year as well as the names for animals.

Children will also practise holding simple conversations in French talking about their age, hobbies and where they live.

Topic

In Science this term we will learn about Earth in Space (this will include a trip to the National Space Centre), followed by Forces in the second half of the term.

In Art and DT, we will be looking at and creating our own Space inspired artwork.

In Computing, we will be learning how to use publisher to create information booklets about internet safety.

In History and Geography we will be looking at space explorers and learning about rivers.

In music, we will be studying 'The Planets' by Gustav Holst and exploring how instruments can be used to mimic sounds and how sounds can be layered for effect.

In indoor PE we will be developing gymnastic skills and playing badminton.

Outdoor PE will involve using our knowledge of invasion games in a variety of contexts including football and basketball.



RE

In RE, the children will explore what it means to be a Muslim in Britain today. They will then move onto exploring why we have places of worship and will be visiting a Mosque and a Synagogue.



Collective Worship

We welcome all faiths and those of no faith.

This Autumn term our theme is 'St Bartholomew's Christian vision – The mustard seed.'

PSHE

We will be exploring class and school rules, and new beginnings.
