

Homework



Across Key Stage One, homework will be set weekly, involving either a Maths or Letters and Sounds/Grammar related activity. This will be set on 'Its Learning'. In addition to this, a choice board will be sent out at the start of each half term to provide **optional** activities which your child may wish to complete. These additional pieces of homework will be celebrated within your child's class when the teacher allocates time to do so.

Homework will be sent home on **Wednesday** and should be returned to school on the following **Monday**.

We encourage you to take time daily to read with your child and please record this in their reading record. At the start of the year, a word wall will also be sent home to highlight the common exception words that your child will need to work towards being able to read and spell across the school year. This can be found in the middle of the reading diary

For the younger children, lessons often require lots of resources. Sometimes we send out a note requesting your children to bring in items which will support lessons taking place at school. Your support is much appreciated.

Letters and Sounds

The children will continue to use the Essential Letters and Sounds scheme of work which will link to Phase 5 teaching and prepare children for the Year 1 Phonics screening Check.

PE

Please ensure your child is in the correct PE kit on PE days. We will control body shape and develop movement sequences in gymnastics and dance. In games, we will practise and improve ball skills.

The children will follow a cross curricular approach to develop their reading and writing.

These include;

- Narrative, poetry and instruction writing.
- Non- Fiction based on Grace Darling and animals, Fiction and stories from other cultures including Meerkat Mail.



We will also be developing;

- Handwriting – correct pencil grip, letter formation and joining up letters
- The use of capital letters, full stops and other punctuation
- Use conjunctions to join sentences.
- Identifying nouns, verbs, adjectives, and adverbs
- Using adjectives in writing

Year 2 Children will be continuing with Read, Write, Spell and Year 1 will continue with the Essential Letters and Sounds Scheme.

Maths

We will focus on developing skills of mental arithmetic and work to improve recall of number bonds, sequences, doubles, halves, addition and subtraction.

The Key Stage One programme of study for the summer term will follow the ‘Maths No Problem’ scheme of work. This will include;

- 2D and 3D shapes
- Fractions
- Addition and subtraction
- Multiplication of 2, 5 and 10
- Mental calculations
- Measurement - focus on time and volume
- Practical Maths and solving mathematical problems



Computing

Handling data and using multimedia.

During this term we are going to be collecting, sorting, classifying data. We are also going to be using safe search engines to conduct some research around a given topic. We are then going to be using this research to create presentations and make some small refinements to them.



Topic

The Great Outdoors



During this topic we will learn about summer time and the plants and animals in the locality. We will investigate different growing conditions for plants. In Art, we will learn about Andy Goldworthy and make natural sculptures. In music, we will use instruments to develop the musical elements of rhythm, pulse and pitch. We will also be learning songs linked to our topic. The Geography and Science will be exploring our locality, how we can keep our environment beautiful, develop mapping skills through our visit to Beacon Hill. In our dance lessons, we will be developing body control and performance skills.

To the Rescue!

In Science, we will look at living things and their habitats including how we can help the animals that live in the habitats around us. We will also be exploring the features of seaside resorts including looking at the similarities and differences between British seaside resorts and other European seaside resorts. The History will be based around the story and life of Grace Darling and how she risked her life to save many others. In Design we will explore food, making seaside snacks. In Music, we will continue to learn the ocarina and also sing songs relating to our topics. Our PE will prepare us for Sports Day as we look at types of track and field sports.

Topical

We will be learning about the Queen and joining in with the Platinum Jubilee Celebrations!



RE



We will learn about how we show we care for others and the world and what it means to belong to a faith community. This will be done through exploring the many faiths in our local area (Loughborough) and the wider community of Leicester.

PSHE

During the first half term, we will be broadening our understanding of what makes a positive and healthy relationship. We will consider our own significant relationships (family, friends and school community) and why these are special and important. We will also consider our own personal attributes as a friend. During the second half term, children are introduced to life cycles and compare this with a human development. They look at simple changes from baby to adult and discuss how they have changed so far. As part of a school’s safeguarding duty, pupils are taught the correct words for private parts of the body. They are also taught what the NSPCC term their ‘swimsuit’ or ‘underwear’ rule. Change is discussed as a natural and normal part of getting older which can bring about happy and sad feelings. Children practise a range of skills to help manage their feelings and learn how to access help if they are worried about change, or if someone is hurting them.

We will prepare the Year 2 children as they get ready for moving to KS2 through developing team building skills during our trip to Beaumanor Hall.
