FoSBA's LOOKING FOR A TREASURER !

The role only requires basic Microsoft Excel skills and duties can be split between two people if needed. It doesn't require any special training but is a vital role linking our charitable status, bank account, and ensuring volunteers are reimbursed their costs.

Duties include:

- o Reimbursement of expenses and school donations
- o Arranging floats before events
- o Cash counting post events and banking
- o Producing financial statements for meetings

The role is essential to FoSBA, we cannot function without it. The school relies on us to fund extra resources. In 2022/23 we donated over £6,000 to renew reading books, pay for 'Jigsaw' (the whole school approach to personal, social, health, and economic education), subsidise coach travel for day trips, buy Go Pro cameras, and learning journey sketchbooks. We finance the Year 6 leavers' presents, and outdoor equipment to support the children's playtime. We cannot do this without a Treasurer.
